

Frequently Asked Questions

How many snowmobiles will you need for your tour?

To get the most enjoyment from your snowmobile experience, we would like to encourage all members of your party to operate each snowmobile as a single rider. However, we understand that some adults may choose to ride as a passenger, and anyone without a valid driver's license must ride as a passenger.

How old do you have to be to drive a snowmobile?

All drivers must be at least 16 years old and have a valid driver's license with their picture on it.

How many people can ride on one snowmobile?

Colorado State law allows no more than two people on one snowmobile. The total combined weight must not be more than 450 lbs.

How old do you have to be to ride on a snowmobile as a passenger?

We recommend that all passengers be at least 5 years of age. All passengers must ride with an adult that is at least 18 years old.

What age do you have to be to rent a snowmobile?

All customers renting a snowmobile must be at least 21 years of age. A parent or legal guardian must sign a waiver for all minors (under the age of 18) who will be driving, but the parents do not have to accompany them on their tour.

Are reservations required?

We strongly recommend reservations; although walk-ins are welcome. All reservations must be guaranteed with a Visa or Mastercard. Please contact Cumbres Adventure Tours toll free at (866) 768-2131 or (719) 376-2161.

Frequently Asked Questions

What about cancellations?

- Weekday cancellations made within 24 hours before the scheduled departure time will not be charged cancellation fees.
- Holiday and weekday cancellations made within 48 hours before the scheduled departure time will not be charged cancellation fees.
- No-shows or cancellations made outside the allocated time frames stated above will be charged 50% of the tour price.
- Should your tour be cancelled due to hazardous weather conditions determined by Cumbres Adventure Tours, you may reschedule your tour and/or cancellation fees will not be applied.

What should I wear?

(Be aware that children are more susceptible to effects of cold, like frostbite so please plan ahead and bring necessary provisions.)

- Always dress in layers
- The first layer should be a comfortable fabric that will wick sweat away from your body
- Avoid pure cotton or linen as a base layer
- The second layer should be a knit sweater or sweatshirt
- Add a coat or jacket as the top layer. It's a good idea to have a coat that is waterproof or water-resistant
- Snow pants for skiing or snow-boarding are also good for snowmobiling as they are waterproof or water resistant
- A scarf, neck warmer, or Bavaclava* is recommended
- Gloves*, wool socks, sunglasses*, sunscreen and hot hands*
